Born in Richmond, Virginia Beard Morton grew up surrounded by Civil War history and legends which captivated her. When she moved to Culpeper County over 30 years ago, her Civil War interest moved with her and after researching Culpeper's rich past, this former teacher turned her passion for history into a best selling novel, *Marching Through Culpeper*, now in its seventh printing.

The battles of Kelly's Ford, Cedar Mountain, and Brandy Station occurred on Culpeper soil and the county witnessed the movement of more troops than any other locale in the nation during the four years of war.

Active in her community and passionate about preservation, Virginia now conducts walking tours through historic Culpeper which reflect the events portrayed in her book. Those on her tour learn about the battles mentioned above as well as legendary figures such as Robert E. Lee, JEB Stuart, John Pelham, "Extra Billy" Smith, and A.P. & Dolly Hill, who all played a part in Culpeper County's Civil War History.
